### OBITUARY

We are very sad to announce that two persons part of the ETA family died very recently:

### **RADMILO NIKOLIC**

Davis Cup captain for Yugoslavia from 1960 to 1968, Radmilo Nikolic was President of the Yugoslavian Federation from 1975 to 1978, member of the ETA Committee of Management from 1976 to 1993, ETA Vice-President from 1981 to 1993. During that time he also acted as Chairman of the ETA Veterans Committee. The AGM elected him Honorary Life Counsellor in 1993.

### JOHN AHLSTRAND

In his quality of General Secretary of the Danish Tennis Association he attended many ETA Annual General Meetings and General Secretaries Meetings. He was a member of the ETA Junior Committee from 1976 to 1993.

### THE OLYMPIC TENNIS EXPERIENCE

At the closing ceremony of the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Juan Antonio Samaranch, President of the International Olympic Committee, stated that the games had been the "best ever". Arguably this is also the case for European tennis. With Europe taking the top four places in the men's singles competition, a silver medal in the women's singles, a bronze in the men's doubles and silver and bronze in the women's doubles, Europe definitely gave an impressive performance. Kafelnikov, in winning the men's Gold medal, made Russian sporting history, as the first ever Russian to win an Olympic Gold medal in tennis. He told a packed press conference after the final "This medal means so much to me, it would have been a real tragedy for me if I had lost this match." For Russia, the year 2000 has been a sensational tennis year and in his post-match conference, Kafelnikov stated that Russia is now taking over international tennis. Marat Safin's win in the US Open, Kafelnikov's Gold medal, and Elena Dementieva's silver medal in the women's event has made this a magical year for Russian tennis. Spain's Alex

Corretja and Albert Costa also managed to come home with a bronze medal in the Men's doubles competition and in the Ladies doubles event, Kristie Boogert and Miriam Oremans from the Netherlands and Els Callens and Dominique Van Roost from Belgium won the silver and bronze medal respectively. With such a wonderful atmosphere at these millennium games, players who took part in the event had the priviledge of experiencing something very special. We look forward to the next Games in Athens!

### 2000 EUROPEAN TOURNAMENT CONFERENCE

The European Tournament Conference focused on the entry level of the game will take place in Barcelona on November 4/5, 2000. Traditionally a Tournament Meeting was arranged in Zürich every year in the autumn and every two-three years there has been a major Tournament Conference, last time in Bergen in 1998. This year's conference is a combination of the two and we have secured an impressive group of presenters representing all aspects of the professional tennis. The first circular with hotel information and entry-form will be sent out shortly to all member nations.

#### THE FUTURE OF THE COACHES SYMPOSIUM

The ETA Development Committee chaired by Jean-Pierre Dartevelle met in Maribor, Slovenia on the occasion of the ETA Top Executives Meeting, and decided to continue to hold the European Coaches Symposium every two years. Therefore, the next edition of the European Coaches Symposium will be held in 2002. In addition the ETA, following the very successful "ETA Mini-tennis Seminar" held in 1999 at the Stade Roland Garros in Paris, will continue to organise a "two days specific theme conference" every two years. The theme of the 2001 Specific Conference will be announced shortly.

#### **COACHES SYMPOSIUM**

The 24<sup>th</sup> European Coaches Symposium took place in Otocec Slovenia from 1-4 October 2000. Organised by the ETA in conjunction with the Slovene Tennis Association, it was the first time that this high level technical conference was held in Slovenia and it was definitely a very successful edition both from the organising and participation point of views.

The renowned tourist resort of Otocec (90 km from Ljubljana) in a beautiful surrounding of forest and lakes together with the great Slovenian hospitality, provided the participants with all the comforts and facilities such as: indoor and outdoor courts, conference hall for 250 people, gym, modern hotel rooms, sauna, restaurants and bars.

This year the four days long European tennis conference,

funded by the ITF/ETA Development Programme, that deals with the development of high performance players and updates on the latest research in the coaching field, featured for the first time three distinctive parts (general/specific/scientific) with lectures and on-court presentations on different topics of general interest in tennis, on various areas of tennis sport science and on specific topics presented by top international experts mainly from Europe.

Even this year the jointly funded ITF/ETA Development Programme provided accommodation and travelling grants to attend the conference for delegates of the following selected European member nations: Romania, Yugoslavia, Albania, Bulgaria, Latvia, Lithuania, Cyprus and Malta. Speakers included top level coaches, sport Doctors and tennis experts such as: J. Brechbuhl (SUI), B. Pestre (FRA), R. Schönborn (GER), M. Toffolo (ITA), F. van Fraayenhoven (NED), B. Pluim (NED), M. Crespo (ITF Research Officer), H. Hauer (AUT), D. MacCurdy (USA), A. Skorudumova (RUS)

Here below some figures and data on this year conference:

- 31 countries represented;
- More than 80 delegates in attendance;
- 21 speakers;

• 12 on and 10 off court presentations on topics such as Injury Prevention, Training Methodology, Tennis Methodology and Psychology, Game Based Coaching, Wheelchair and many others.

#### ENTRY DEADLINE

Monday 3 weeks (21 days) before the Monday of the Tournament Week.

#### MAIN DRAW WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE

Monday 2 weeks (14 days) before the Monday of the Tournament Week.

Players are only allowed to be on <u>ONE</u> Main Draw list for that Tournament Week after the Main Draw Withdrawal Deadline.

If a player does not withdraw and remains on more than one Main Draw list for that Tournament Week she will be removed from all but one Main Draw list based on the following criteria:-

- a a) the prize money level of the event (removed from the lower prize money event);
- b b) the highest position held on the Main Draw Acceptance list;
  - c) as determined by the appropriate Entry Office.

Players who withdraw from the Main Draw after the Main Draw Withdrawal Deadline will be fined.

#### QUALIFYING DRAW WITHDRAWAL DEADLINE

Monday 1 week (7 days) before the Monday of the Tournament Week.

Players are only allowed to be on <u>ONE</u> Qualifying Draw list for that Tournament Week after the Qualifying Draw Withdrawal Deadline.

If a player does not withdraw and remains on more than one Qualifying Draw list for that Tournament Week she will be removed from all but one Qualifying Draw list based on the following criteria:-

- a) the prize money level of the event (removed from the lower prize money event);
- b) the highest position held on the Qualifying Draw Acceptance list;
- c) as determined by the appropriate Entry Office.

Players who withdraw from the Qualifying Draw after the Qualifying Draw Withdrawal Deadline will be fined.

#### MAIN DRAW DOUBLES - MDO

Players may enter the Doubles competition as Main Draw Only entries.

#### **COMPOSITION OF THE DRAW - \$10,000 TOURNAMENTS**

The Singles Qualifying draw of a \$10,000 Women's Circuit event may not exceed 128 players.
