## **TC BONNEVOIE EUROPEAN CLUB CHAMPION FOR WOMEN**

It was the third time that the final round of the European Club Championships for Women took place at the TC Bonnevoie, a beautiful Club outside Luxembourg City. In spite of the bad weather, the winners of the different National Interclub

Championships, showed their best from 5<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> July the second week of Wimbledon. Players like Anne Kremer (WTA 34), Denisa Chladkova (WTA 37), Anna Smashnova (WTA 59), and Rita Grande (WTA 61) were fighting to become the European Club Champions.

The Final between TC Bonnevoie and TC Napoli was played on a high standard, which provided excellent tennis. The local team won the Final 4:2 and became for the first time in their history European Club Champions.

## **CZECH JUNIORS WIN NATIONS RANKING**

The 2000 European Junior Individual Championships took place from 24<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> July 2000. They were hosted by the Italian Tennis Federation, The Lawn Tennis Association and Swiss Tennis, according to the three age categories. This year 43 Nations took part in the competition, which once more was very well organized by the following clubs: TC Solaro & CT San Remo in San Remo/ITA (14&U), Queenswood LTA Centre in Hatfield/GBR (16U), Tennis Club Klosters in Klosters/SUI (18&U).

The Czech Republic was the most successful Nation, followed by the Slovak Republic and Great Britain.

## ANNE KREMER IN THE SPOT

A. Kremer (LUX) is 24 years old and has already been four times the "sports woman of the year" in her country. She turned pro in September 1998 and since then she has been moving up to position 34 in the Sanex WTA Ranking. In 1999 she had some promising results like 3<sup>rd</sup> round in Wimbledon and Miami, Winner of ITF/Midland Mich. USA and Finalist in Pattaya.

**Congratulations for the great victory in the 2000 European Club Championships for Women.**

**What does it mean to you and the TC Bonnevoie to win the European Club Championships for Women?**

It is a great title for the Club and its President especially as the Real Club Tennis Barcelona won (Matches 3-3 Sets 8:7) by a narrow margin against us last year. Furthermore it is the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Club so what could be a better birthday present? For me it is also a big satisfaction as we players have been trying hard for three years to win the title.

**It seems that you enjoy playing team competitions. You regularly play the FED CUP, European Women's Team Championships and the European Club Championships for Women. Could you give a comment to this statement?**

Tennis is an individual sport and to play in a team competi-

tion gives me a change to the daily tennis routine. As it is not possible to win points in such competitions the pressure is not so big for the players, which guarantees good tennis. The environment in such championships is always quite relaxed and that is also connected to the fact that no points can be won.

**As the number one player of Luxembourg you will be playing the Olympics. What does it mean to you to be part of the Games and what are your expectations?**

I participated already 4 years ago in the Olympic Games and it was very special. It is important to me to represent Luxembourg in Sydney and I would say it is the highlight of this tennis season. I expect from myself to play good tennis and to win some rounds but to be honest it also depends on the draw.

**Your tennis has been very stable in the last 12 months, which is visible from the WTA Ranking. What are your goals for the future concerning the ranking?**

I have been a pro for two years and it was my first aim to stabilise my ranking, which I managed very well. The next step would be to enter the top 30 and I might be able to do this during this summer, as I have not many points to defend. In a long run I hope that I can reach the top 20.

**You live in a small country and you are the Luxembourg sports woman of the year. Can you feel the publicity around you? Has it somehow changed your life?**

I receive a lot of attention in the Luxembourg media and the interest of the people is rather big which is an honour for me but still my fellow citizens are very discrete people so I have a lot of privacy.

**Thank you Anne for answering those questions. We wish you all the best in Sydney and we hope to see you also in the future playing all our events.**

## ETA REGIONAL MEETING IN TURKEY

The traditional meetings of Regional Associations taking place during the ITF AGM were held this year in Antalya (TUR) on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June.

Delegates from 30 nations attended the ETA meeting chaired by President A. Pujol.

The President gave some information about upcoming meetings and announced that the ITF President called for the first time a meeting with the Presidents of all Regional Associations for the following day, where he would like to tackle two important matters: decentralization (more self determination to the regions) and membership (regional membership to be a condition for ITF membership).

A. Pujol asked for the opinion of the delegates about applying the "pre-elections" procedure again next year for the elections of the ITF Board of Directors. The meeting was in favour of it and the deadlines will be checked.

Ellen de Lange, Manager of Wheelchair Tennis at the ITF, made a short presentation and asked the delegates to support wheelchair tennis in their country as much as possible, by integrating it in their Associations or having close relationship with existing wheelchair associations.

When the ITF President F. Ricci Bitti and Executive Vice-President J. Margets joined the meeting, several items on the agenda of the ITF AGM, especially the proposals for changes in the Davis Cup/ Fed Cup Rules and Rules of Tennis were discussed.

## COACHES EDUCATION IN EASTERN EUROPE

Following the very successful project funded by Olympic Solidarity, which allowed the Macedonian Tennis Association to set up their own Coaches Education System early this year, several initiatives with regard to coaches education have been held so far in Eastern Europe by the ITF/ETA in co-operation with their member nations.

### LEVEL II COACHES COURSE

The Latvian Tennis Union played host to the 1<sup>st</sup> Regional Level II Coaches Course in Eastern Europe. The course was held in the beautiful resort of Jurmala at the national tennis centre from 17-28 July, with 23 high profile coaches taking part that were nominated by the National Associations from the following countries:

Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bulgaria, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Moldova and Yugoslavia.

The course experts were Frank Couraud,

course director and ITF Development Projects Administrator; Luca Santilli, ITF/ETA Development Officer for Europe, who worked very closely with the LTU to make the event possible; and Frank Zlesak, the very experienced coach from Czech Republic.

The project is part of the Coach Education programme in Eastern Europe and the purpose of the course was to train the coaches in coaching advanced level players by using the ITF recommended coaching syllabus and to assist these top coaches with the Coaches Education programmes in their own nations.

### LEVEL I COACHES COURSE

Following a successful application to their National Olympic Committee for an Olympic Solidarity Grant, the Lithuanian Tennis Union was able to hold a Level 1 Coaches Course as the first part of their Coach Education Programme established with the assistance of the ITF/ETA.

The nine days course was conducted by Luca Santilli the ITF/ETA Development Officer with 22 coaches in attendance from 29 May – 7 June at the School Tennis Centre in Siauliai.

A group of experts is now supposed to revise and study the content of the ITF Level 1 syllabus and adapt it to the necessities of the Lithuanian Tennis Union while the next Level I will be conducted by local tutors with the ITF/ETA supervision in the year 2001. It is hoped that in two years time the Lithuanian Tennis Union will be able to set up a complete programme in order to be able to educate the future generations of tennis coaches.

## OBITUARY

### ISTAN GULYAS

Former President of the Hungarian Tennis Association and friend of ETA, Istvan Gulyas has died aged 69. We remember him of course first as an outstanding tennis champion, but also as big supporter of tennis in Hungary and Europe. As President of the Hungarian Tennis

Association during nearly ten years he was a real ambassador for tennis in Hungary. Under his leadership the Hungarian Tennis Association joined the European Tennis Association in 1977 and entertained since that date close and fruitful co-operation with the ETA.

## 2000 EUROPEAN INDIVIDUAL JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

In 1976, the European Tennis Association created this competition, where the best junior European players have been given the opportunity to show their excellent level of play

and commitment combined with a cheerful and friendly atmosphere. Also this year the competition was the meeting point where the "Stars of the Future" got to-

gether and offered a marvelous spectacle.

The Czech Republic won this time the Nation's Ranking, followed by the Slovak Republic and Great Britain.

## EUROPEAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

June and July are two important months for European Veterans Tennis. The best players from the whole world meet the same week in Baden-Baden (Germany) and Pörtschach (Austria) to compete for the European Champion titles in all different age categories from 40 to 85.

205 players from 20 different countries played in Baden-Baden and 325 from 21 countries in Pörtschach from 12-18 June.

Some 1999 European Champions managed to defend their title like Regina Marsikova (CZE) who defeated Gerda

Preissing (GER) in the W40 category, Werner Mertins (GER) against John O'Brien (AUS) in the M65 category. Elisabeth Perusch (AUT) (W65) and Monique Kyburz (SWI) (W70) achieved to become double European Championships this year, having already obtained the title at the European Indoor Championships in Seefeld in January. The same for Peter Pokorny (AUT) (M60), Werner Mertins (GER) (M65), and Bernard Kempa (GER) (M80).

They are certainly in the good way to become Play-

ers of the Year, award given to all players positioned at the first place of the ETA Rankings at the end of the year.

The European Championships for players aged 35 was hold on July 12-16 for the first time at the beautiful site of the TC Noris Nürnberg in Germany and the victory went to Olga Shaposhnikova and Goran Prpic.

**EUROPEAN VETERANS CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Ladies first: the Championships for Ladies 40/50 were played again this year in Le Touquet (France). Nine teams entered the category 40 while eleven teams competed in the category 50, which is the highest number of entries ever in this competition.

Italy was back after an interval of three years and a Russian team, the TC Sarov, participated for the first time. It was a good comeback for Italy as the TC Lombardo won against the Chandos LTC 3-0 (W40) from Great Britain.

There was a British Final in the W50 Championships: the 45 Club (GBR) defeated the Warwick Boat Club 2-0.

The European Veterans Clubs Championships for Men will take place as follows:

Men 45: August 29 – September 3 in Feldkirch (Austria): 18 teams entered.

Men 55: September 19-23 in Velden (Austria): 15 teams

Men 60: September 5-10 in Birmingham (Great Britain): 7 teams.



## THE 2000 SPECIAL OLYMPICS EUROPEAN GAMES – “LET’S WIN TOGETHER”

The 2000 Special Olympics European Games, the largest sports event in Europe for people with mental handicaps, were held May 27-June 4, 2000 in Groningen, the Netherlands. Approximately 2,000 athletes with mental handicaps from more than 50 countries throughout Europe and Eurasia participated. Athletes competed in aquatics, athletics, basketball, bowling, cycling, equestrian, football, gymnastics, sailing, table tennis and tennis. Judo and korfbal were offered as demonstration sports. In addition to the athletes, approximately 750 coaches, 1,000 family members and 1,500 volunteers participated in the Games.

“The 2000 Special Olympics European Games is a unique sporting event that highlights the positive and life-transforming role sport plays in the lives of athletes with mental handicaps,” said Michael Smith, director of Special Olympics Europe/Eurasia.

Approximately 35 Special Olympics tennis players competed in Doubles, Mixed Doubles and Singles. The athletes represented six Special Olympics programs in Europe: Monaco, Netherlands, Poland, Spain, Switzerland and the United Kingdom. Tennis players from programs in Alabama, New York and Rhode Island represented a guest delegation from the United States.

Unique to Special Olympics is its system of divisioning, a process whereby athletes or teams are placed into groups in which they compete against other individuals or teams of approximately the same age and ability. Divisioning allows athletes of all abilities to compete in Special Olympics events at a fair and challenging level.

“For people with mental handicaps, tennis and other sports can improve their physical abilities, social skills and sense of individual worth,” said Jose Javier Suarez, a coach with the tennis team representing Special Olympics Spain. Javier said he likes training but the best moments for him are seeing the expression on his athletes’ faces when they are presented with their medals. “The happiness on their faces is unforgettable,” he said.

Special Olympics, founded in the United States in 1968 by Eunice Kennedy Shriver, is the world’s largest year-round program of sports training and competitions for individuals with mental handicaps. One million athletes in nearly 150 countries train and compete in Olympic-style summer and winter games at local, national and international events. Through its sports programs, Special Olympics strives to provide long-term benefits to individuals’ health, self-esteem and social integration.

The Brussels-based Special Olympics Europe/Eurasia works to expand Special Olympics programs in 53 countries from Iceland to the Russia-China border. Special Olympics national program staff and volunteers in the Europe/Eurasia region currently bring sports opportunities to around 300,000 athletes in 5,000 communities.

In 2003, Ireland will be the site of the XI Special Olympics World Summer Games. This will be the first time that World Summer Games will be held outside of the United States. Approximately 7,000 athletes from 150 countries are expected to participate in the Summer Games that will run from June 20-29.

## THE IMPACT OF INTERNET ON THE WOMEN'S CIRCUIT

ETA website [www.etatennis.com](http://www.etatennis.com) was launched in March 2000. It provides valuable information for women players such as Acceptance lists, tournament fact sheets, calendar and calendar change information. The site is automatically updated from the Women's Department database every two hours.

Do players use this new service? A survey has been recently carried out at several women's events. It showed women players know and very much appreciate this new service. It al-

lows them to find the information they need 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Most often they are looking for their positions at various Acceptance lists and fact sheet information. More and more tournament organisers provide internet access for players directly in the club nowadays. The survey also brought some interesting ideas for future improvement of the site: providing links to tournament organiser's websites, publishing final tournament cut offs and results.

## SHORT SETS ALTERNATIVE SCORING SYSTEM EXPERIMENT

The ITF, ATP Tour and WTA Tour are constantly searching for potential improvements that will make the game of tennis more and more fan-friendly. In the course of these efforts, we have all been considering the merits of a new match format based on shorter sets and we have devised a plan for testing this alternative scoring system.

### The Concept

It is the combination of two attractive ideas, designed to increase the number of exciting moments and points during a match:

- Shortening each set in order to get more quickly to its most exciting part (the end);
- Playing more sets, providing more opportunities for fresh starts, momentum changes and exciting moments.

Short sets are not meant to change the average length of

matches. Nor have they been devised to address a TV issue or fix a problem.

Short sets are simply viewed as a potential improvement for our sport which is at least worth an experiment.

### The Testing Plan

Following the ITF AGM's decision to include short sets in the Rules of Tennis as an alternative scoring system on an experimental basis for the years 2000 and 2001, the ITF, ATP Tour and WTA Tour have agreed on a testing plan for professional tennis:

- This will start with some ITF Men's Circuit tournaments from 24 July 2000;
- ITF Women's Circuit tournaments will follow after the Olympics;
- There will then be testing in 2001 in Men's Challenger and ATP and WTA Tour level events if analysis of feedback

from the initial stages of testing is positive.

Technical analysis of the matches will be conducted in detail as well as surveys among players, coaches spectators, media and organisers. Material to aid in this process will be provided to each event and National Association.

### The Format

- Matches will be best of five sets
- The first player/team who wins 4 games wins that set, provided there is a margin of two games over the opponent(s). If the score reaches 4 games all, a tie-break shall be played.
- Possible scores in a set: 4-0, 4-1, 4-2, 5-3, 5-4
- Example of a score in a completed match: 4-1, 3-5, 4-2, 4-5, 4-1

## DÉJÀ VU IN PARIS AS THE NETHERLANDS - Israel and Australia reign again

The 2000 Invacare World Team Cup was held at one of Europe's most pristine private clubs, Cercle du Bois de Boulogne in Paris from 17-23 July. On court however, the 2000 World Team Cup took on a distinct "been there, done that" feel, where, with the exception of the Australian men's appearance, the remaining finals were mirror images of last year. The Israelis beat USA once again in the quad finals the Dutch women overturned last year's outcome, beating Australia 2-0 to avenge their defeat this time. It was left to the Aussie men to keep the flag flying, which they did, outhitting the Netherlands 2-1.

It had seemed as if the Aussies' World Team Cup campaign would be in tatters as early as their opening match against Sweden. World No. 7 David Johnson began the Aussie challenge by bowing out to Peter Wikstrom, ranked 66 places below him. World No. 3 Hall followed and came back down from a set and 41 down, only to hammer out 11 of the next twelve games and finally win in three sets. The Aussies were on their way. The hottest combination on the Tour, Hall and Johnson have carved a 24-1 match record, winning six in 2000. The "Wheelchair Woodies" have

also earned the title "The Unbeatables" – an accolade they lived up to throughout the week.

Led by world No.2 Ricky Molier, No.4 Robin Ammerlaan and No.12 Eric Stuurman, the top-seeded Dutch team made quick work of their opponents, arriving in the World Team Cup final for the third consecutive year. The heavy favourites to repeat left little doubt of their intentions with 3-0 wins over Hungary, Poland and France.

Meeting for the first time in a World Team Cup final, the encounter between Australia and the Netherlands was expected to be close. Johnson dropped the opener against Robin Ammerlaan leaving Hall to salvage Aussie hopes against the mighty Molier. Commanding play from Hall levelled the score to one match all and when "The Unbeatable" lived up their reputation in a tense doubles, the Aussies were celebrating.

In the women's competition, the burden of Australia's defence title fell on the heavy taped shoulders of world No. 1 Daniela Di Toro. Unsteady play from her team-mate Branka Pupovac in the early rounds meant Di Toro had little opportunity to rest her play-

ing arm. Resilience and determination earned Team Australia a place in the final but, in the end, the talent rich Dutch team, with four of the world's top five players, was too good this year. The Dutch women made their fourteenth final appearance in the event's fifteen-year history. In the final, Aussie hopes faded when Sonja Peters opened the door for the Netherlands with a three-set win over Pupovac leaving the injured Di Toro to face arch rival Esther Vergeer in the crucial second singles. On this occasion the task proved too much for the ITF World Champion and Vergeer took full advantage of her injured opponent to secure the 13<sup>th</sup> World Team Cup title for the Dutch.

In the quad event the Israeli team returned once again unseeded and once again left with a Cup title after beating the United States 2-0. Despite their team containing four out of the world's top five, the Americans found themselves outplayed with Haim Lev and Shraga Weinberg securing a single match a piece for Israel.
