#### ITF/ETA SMALL STATES CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first edition of the ITF/ETA Small States Championships 14 & under was hosted by the Malta Tennis Federation at Marsa Sports Club. Participating nations were Andorra, Cy-

prus, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Iceland and Malta. Unfortunately Monaco and San Marino could not send a team this year.

The creation of the competition was welcomed by all players and captains and from the beginning everyone felt like a full member of the Small States family.

This competition consisted of two feed-in consolation tournaments, which guaranteed players one singles and doubles match per day. Malta was dominating the girls draw and Steffi Pace (picture) won both singles and doubles in both tournaments, countrygirl and doubles partner Tanya Camilleri being second. Players from Luxembourg, Liechtenstein and Cyprus were dominating the boys' tournaments. Ken Muno (LUX)

won the first one and Cian-Carlo Besimo (LIE) the second tournament, while Kenny Banzer (Davis Cup debutant this year) became number two in the overall ranking. ITF/ETA Small States Team has been selected based on the results of these two individual tournaments. This team will play four

weeks ETA Tour tournaments in Europe financed by ITF and ETA.

"The Small States Championships and Development Championships are good examples of the joint development ventures of the ITF and ETA. We are looking forward to continuing these events also in the future" says Jean-Pierre Dartevelle, Vice-President of the ETA.

#### ITF/ETA DEVELOPMENT CHAMPIONSHIPS

Once again since its inception in 1995, the Development Championships 14/16 & Under, proved to be one of the most interesting competition of the ETA Junior Tour calendar in East Europe. The 6<sup>th</sup> ITF/ETA Development Championships part of the joint ITF/ ETA Development programme in Europe, took place in Skopije, Macedonia and Batumi, Georgia from the 23 April - 4 May 2000 with more than 110 entries from 15 European nations. Hosted by the Tennis Associations of Macedonia (14U) and Georgia (16U) for the first time, who

both did a great job from the organisational point of view by providing the participants with excellent playing conditions and hospitality.

Furthermore, the success of the Championships was secured by the competition's format "feed-in system", which allowed all participants to play a minimum of one singles match every day for the twoweek competition.

In the Girl 14 & Under category Yakimova Anastasia (BLR) performed with confidence and authority winning the second week event and reaching the final in the first

week event loosing only one match to Tzvetana Pironkova from Bulgaria. On the Boys side, Grubin Alexandre (YUG) and Anagnastopol Victor (ROM) won an event each and secured themselves a place in the ITF/ETA Eastern European Team.

#### 2000 EUROPEAN COACHES SYMPOSIUM

The very traditional technical conference of the European Tennis Association is to be held from 1 – 4 October at Otocec organised by the ETA in conjunction with the Slovene Tennis Association. Each of the 48 member nations of the European Tennis Association have been invited to attend the 24<sup>th</sup> edition of the Symposium.

The Symposium will concentrate on the development of high performance players and

will provide updates on the latest research in the coaching field. Three themes will be covered during the four-day conference: general interest in tennis, tennis sport science and specific topics given by top coaches.

The programme will include on and off court presentations on topics such as Injury Prevention, Training Methodology, Tennis Methodology and Psychology, Game Based Coaching and many others.

Speakers will include top level coaches, sport Doctors and tennis experts: Bernard Pestre (FRA), Richard Schönborn (GER), Ivo Van Aken (BEL), Frank van Fraayenhoven (NED), Babette Pluim (NED), Dave Miley (ITF, Executive Director, Tennis Development), Miguel Crespo (ITF Research Officer), Ann Pankhurst (GBR), Helmut Hauer (AUT) and Balazs Taroczy (HUN, ETA Committee of Management).

#### **DEVELOPMENT COMMITEE MEETING IN RIGA**

Juris Savickis, President of the Latvian Tennis Union, invited his colleagues of the ETA Development Committee to hold a meeting in Riga on May 13. the following persons were present: Jean-Pierre Dartevelle, Chairman, Philios Christodoulou (CYP), Romano Frola (ITA), John James (GBR), ETA Honorary Life President and ITF Development Adviser Heinz Grimm, as well as Charlotte Ferrari (ETA Dir. Administration), Olli Mäenpää (ETA Dir. Marketing & Events) and Luca Santilli (ITF/ETA Dev. Officer).

It was the best opportunity for all members to get a better idea about the situation of tennis in Latvia. During their visit to the National Tennis Centre in Jurmala, they were informed about the different projects initiated by the Latvian Tennis Union to develop the game in their country.

The Committee's main subject of discussion was the European Development strategy for the years 2001-2003 including a mission statement, main strategies, goals and tasks, budget for

2001. This project will be submitted to the ETA Committee of Management at the beginning of June.

The Committee also heard the activity report of Luca Santilli including site visit reports, preparation of the European Coaches Symposium to take place in Otocec (Slovenia) on October 1-5, etc. Olli Mäenpää reported about general issues and the preparation for the Top Executives Meeting which will be organized in Maribor (Slovenia) on October 6-8.

Played at the Monte Avendino Club, the event turned into an almost exclusively Spanish tournament after the Quarterfinals. The only exception was Eva Dyrberg of Denmark, who fought her way to the semifinals where she lost after a long battle to Virginia Ruano Pascual of Spain.

Ruano Pascual then faced another Spanish player, Ma

Antonia Sanchez Lorenzo, in the finals. The crowd saw a

The event was played for the first time in 1997 in Estoril and this year it will be its 4<sup>th</sup> edition. The competition will take place at the TC Bonnevoie, beautiful Club outside Luxembourg City. In 1999 we had a record number of participating teams, which performed their best tennis during a period of one week. Players like Anne Kremer (WTA 31), Ma. Antonia Sanchez (WTA 39), Ange-

les Montolio (WTA 64), Laurence Courtois (WTA 69) Amanda Hopmans (WTA 89), Jelena Kostanic (WTA 128), including Junior Grand Slam winners were fighting to become the European Club Champion.

Nine Teams entered the 2000 Championships which will take place during the 2nd week of Wimbledon: TK Split (CRO), TC Benrath (GER), Filothei TC (GRE), TC Napoli (ITA), TK Ridze (LTV), TC Bonnevoie (LUX), TC Arquebusiers (LUX), Ted Club (TUR), TC Red Star (YUG).
